



Message from the Principal

Dear Parents,

Once again we are on our way to a successful year! Thank you all for your wonderful help and support as we begin the new school year. I enjoyed seeing many of you at our Back-to-School Night, the Newark Day Parade and at our first Coffee with the Principal. My personal philosophy has always been, "It takes a village to raise a child" therefore, it is important to me that there is a strong cooperation between home and school. I welcome your comments and questions and happy to set up appointments to discuss any concerns. Better, join us for a relaxed Coffee with the Principal schedule for Friday, October 27th which is the fourth Friday of every other month starting from 8:30am – 9:15 am. We do have a Spanish translator for our non-English speakers. I hope to see many of you there.

The Common Core State standards and Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS) are fully employed with the integration of technology. This year we continue to implement both Positive Behavior Intervention and support (PBIS), and Response to Intervention (RTI) as a way to positively reinforce student behavior and through RTI provide students with academic support which are targeted to their needs.

We are also implementing for the first time our Science Technology Engineering Arts and Math (STEAM) program with an emphasis on the **Arts** for this year.

Therefore, parents, teachers, support staff, and administration we all have an important role to encourage our children to become active learners. It is my desire to continue providing expanded opportunities for our students to acquire the skills and knowledge needed to be successful. Lincoln is a place where children come first, and staff members are committed to providing meaningful, engaging work that promise to make for another exciting and productive year.

Family Involvement has a positive effect on Student behavior

- When families are involved, students exhibit more positive attitudes and behavior
- When students report feeling support from both home and school, they have more self-confidence, feel school is more important, and they tend to do better in school.
- Student at-risk behaviors such as teasing, fighting, and other antisocial behaviors decrease as parent involvement increases.

Before You Go:

- Think about what you want to tell the teacher about your child. Is there anything you would like to tell the teacher that would help her better understand your child?

- How does your child feel about school?
- What special interests does your child have?

Ask your child what s/he would like you to talk to the teacher about. And what s/he would like you to look at in the room.

At the Conference:

- Arrive on time! Be aware that other parents are waiting for their conferences and use your time wisely.

- Ask questions about any part of the school program that concerns you?

The teacher will be prepared to tell you about your child's school work. Here are some questions you might ask:

- * What are my child's strongest subjects?
- * What areas need improvement?
- * What can I do to help my child – and what can I do to help him help himself

When you get home:

- Be sure to tell your child the positive things that were said at the conference.
- Keep communicating with the teacher about your child throughout the year, through notes, email, or voice mail messages.

If you have any other special concerns, please contact your child's teacher or me. We are looking forward to seeing all of you at fall conferences, as well as at the many wonderful social events that PALS has planned throughout the year. Healthy Halloween Treats

Reminders

Establishing routines and procedures to be used in an emergency situation is an essential part of working to keep the members of our school community safe. Throughout the year, we practice monthly fire, earthquake and/or intruder drills which help students and staff to develop the skills necessary in an emergency situation. The information and feedback from these drills are used to continually refine our school wide safety plan.

~Important Information from the Lincoln Office~

Daily Absence Verification

Calling in your child's daily absences is very important. The office phone number is 510-818-3500. This number has voicemail so a message can be left at any time day or night. Absences should be called in each day as soon as possible, but no later than 9:45am. When doing so, please leave the following information:

Please say your child's name clearly.
Teachers name and room #
Reason for absence i.e. : illness or doctor's appointment, out of town. An out of town absence is an unexcused absence. For family emergency absences, please make sure you call in as well as send a note with your students stating why they were out.

Please leave a call back number. Please remember you have 72 hours to clear an absence before it goes to an unexcused absence.

Please keep your child home if they have gotten sick or have a fever. They need to be fever, vomit and diarrhea free for 24 hours before coming back to school. It is a parent's responsibility to call in each absence. The office will make phone calls each day to clear absences, but it is most helpful if parents helped us by calling first. We appreciate your help in calling the office.



Please Keep in Mind!

If your child is getting picked up early by someone on their emergency card, please advise them they must have their photo ID with them and they have to be over 18 years old to pick them up.

Please pick up students promptly after school dismissal @ 2:32 Mon-Thurs & 1:05 on Friday's.

Please notify the office of any address or phone number changes right away.

Homework Requests ~ Homework will be available upon request. Please call or email your child's teacher before 10:00am to request their homework. Homework may be available after school pending teacher's availability.

Visitors are welcome to the school; however for the safety of all students, all visitors must check in at the office, sign the "visitor log" and wear a visitor badge while on campus. If parents/guardians are visiting to observe their child's classroom, they must arrange their visit with the teacher and principal prior to the day of visiting and limit their stay, so that it does not interfere with the classroom program.

We will have a couple of days where parents can come up to have lunch with students, but other than that, we ask that parents don't come up on campus for lunch

Parents, please listen to your messages before calling the school back. There are often times where the teachers call from the classroom and the office is unaware why they called.

Please try not to send your students with a lot of extra cash on them. We are not responsible for any lost items.


Reminder for Parents regarding Birthday treats.


